


- Strong bipartisan majorities think college is unaffordable and support addressing education costs. Over 3/4ths of voters believe that college is currently unaffordable and nearly 3/4ths think that the Trump administration should prioritize reducing that cost.
- Addressing college affordability is personal and has a political upside for the Trump administration.
  Nearly 2/3rds of voters say they would be personally impacted if college was made more affordable and majorities say that they would have a more positive impression of the administration if they took steps to address this with very little downside.

## OVERWHELMING BELIEF: COLLEGE IS UNAFFORDABLE.


College in America is viewed as unaffordable across partisan lines.

### BIPARTISAN SUPPORT FOR REDUCING THE COST OF COLLEGE. —


Do you think that the incoming Trump administration should prioritize reducing the cost of college?

Do you agree or disagree with the following statement?


If the next administration took steps to make public community college and public four-year college tuition-free, I or a member of my family would be more likely to pursue additional education and training.

Bipartisan support for addressing college affordability – with little downside.

Pluralities across partisan lines would have a more positive impression of the Trump administration if they took steps to make college more affordable and very few voters across partisan lines would have a more negative impression.


